Alexander the Great

Students will be looking at the life of Alexander the Great as he began his conquest of the Persian Empire.

Lessons will cover the key events of Alexander the Great's life as he invaded the Persian Empire, conquering such provinces as Tyre and Egypt. Students will look at how ancient sources describe Alexander's character and the central figures and relationships that he had during his reign and life.
