Principles of Care in Health and Social Care Settings (RO32) – person centred values, protecting service users and service providers in health and social care settings

Definition
Organisations that provide help and support for people in need.
They rely on donations and volunteers such as MIND.
Traditions and customs adopted by different groups of people
How we gain skills and abilities
Recognising individuality and understanding individual beliefs and
wishes about their care
To do with income, debt and employment (money)
Our feelings and what can affect them
The space around us – in our home, around our home, our
community
Professional care by trained people such as a nurse
Physical changes in an individual's weight and size
Doing as much as you can for yourself
Everyone is unique with different needs. For example, two people
with diabetes might not need the same medical care.
Care given by individuals who may not be trained such as a friend
helping with childcare if the parent has broken their leg
