Supporting Individuals through Life Events (RO33) – looking at life stages, life events, the impact of life events and researching sources of support for individuals after the life event

Principles of Care in Health and Social Care Settings (RO32) – person centred values, protecting service users and service providers in health and social care settings

Keyword	Definition
Charity	Organisations that provide help and support for people in need. They rely on donations and volunteers such as MIND.
Cultural Factor	Traditions and customs adopted by different groups of people
Development	How we gain skills and abilities
Dignity and Respect	Recognising individuality and understanding individual beliefs and wishes about their care
Economic	To do with income, debt and employment (money)
Emotional Factor	Our feelings and what can affect them
Environmental Factor	The space around us – in our home, around our home, our community
Formal Care	Professional care by trained people such as a nurse
Growth	Physical changes in an individual's weight and size
Independence	Doing as much as you can for yourself
Individuality	Everyone is unique with different needs. For example, two people with diabetes might not need the same medical care.
Informal Care	Care given by individuals who may not be trained such as a friend helping with childcare if the parent has broken their leg

Life Stage	As we go through life, we move through different phases
Infancy	0 – 3 years
Childhood	4 – 10 years
Adolescence	11 – 18 years
Young Adulthood	19 – 45 years
Middle Adulthood	46 – 65 years
Older Adulthood	65 + years
Partnership	Working with others, including professionals, family members and the service user. For example, a child at school working with the teacher and parent
Physical Factor	Relating to our body, influencing how it grows, develops and functions
PIES	Physical, Intellectual, Emotional, Social
Service	An organisation within health and social care such as a doctors surgery or a care home
Service Provider	Individuals who work in a setting and provide care and support to service users
Service User	Individuals who access health and social care services
Social Factor	Interacting with others – relationships whether positive or negative
