	aberration	An aberration is something that is abnormal or changed, usually in negative way.
	analepsis	Analepsis is a narrative structure in which events are told (or retold) at a point later than their chronological place in the story. Chapters 9 and 10 are examples of analepsis.
	conscience	A person's conscience is their individual judge of right and wrong.
	debasement	Debasement is when something is reduced in quality or value.
	duality	Duality means containing two parts.
	façade	A façade is a false front, or a deceptive outward appearance.
	hypocrisy	Hypocrisy is the act of saying one thing but doing another; when a person contradicts themselves.
	motif	A motif is a recurring idea or symbol in a book, poem, play or film.
	moral	Moral means concerned with the principle of what is right and fair OR a story containing a lesson about what is right and fair.
	pathetic fallacy	Pathetic fallacy is when the weather or environment contribute to or mimic the emotions or a character. It is a common Gothic convention.
	physiognomy	Physiognomy is the idea that a person's character or personality is reflected in their facial features and physical appearance.
	pious	Pious means devoted to religion.
	repress	Repress means to restrain, hold back or push down feelings, thoughts or desires.
	respectable	Respectable means conforming to what is considered good, proper and correct.
	troglodytic	Troglodytic means primitive or unevolved.
