Tone		Must have an emotion before it Angry tone
Pace		The speed at which you speak Fast/Slow
Pitch		The quality of your speech, usually to suggest your age, gender or mood High/Low

Emphasis		Used to stress a word, however you must always say where and how you say it Emphasise the word "and" by raising my volume
Pause		The length in-between words Short/Long
