

KS4 Curriculum Child Care Overview OCR Cambridge Nationals

Curriculum Intent

GCSE Child Development will give students an insight into child development from pre-conception care through pregnancy and as the child develops into their early years. Students will have a mixture of practical and theory based lessons that will allow them to put their learning into context. They will have to observe a child under the age of 5 years and plan an activity to support an area of this child's development. We work closely with Emneth Nursery in order to support students in observing a young child. Students will also be asked to take part in a practical assessment of preparing a baby's bottle.

What do students do with this knowledge or these skills?



They will be able to put this knowledge and skills into practice with either higher education on in a career. You can use this to study A levels or gain an apprenticeship in the early years sector.
