## Work of the Week



### Eyjafjallajökull eruption

Location- D6

Equipment - Laptop, TV screen, Work sheets, white bord, white board pen (x2 colors)

Aim- To state what happened at the Eyjafjallajökull eruption

#### Objectives

To understand the course of the gruption.

#### Introduction:

First, I will check current understanding of knowledge on the Eyjafaltajökull eruption by using the big white board and getting them to do a mind map. This will stay there until the end of the lesson so they can add to it for a consolidation task

#### Development:

First, we will start with the general geographics of the location to understand the potential impacts of an eruption.

Then we will do onto explaining the plate tectonics underneath the Iceland and how it's got extremely thin crusts which is why Iceland is so prone to having volcanic eruptions.

Then we will move onto the effects of the eruption by explaining the effects like earthquakes (3.1 magnitude) and extreme flooding

Finals we will move on to the impact of the Eyjafjallajökull eruption where we will explain impacts whilst also explaining the amount of money lost.

Consolidation:

I will be getting the class to go back up to the white board and write down what they have now learnt and compare it to what they already knew. This will be done in a different color pen if available.

#### Timings

- Intro 3 minutes
- Development 9 minutes
- Consolidation 3 minuets

All depending on the prior knowledge of the students in the class and how quickly they can take notes.






- A congratulations to our aspiring veterinary students and Oxbridge applicants who have successfully submitted their applications this week!
