With changes to government guidance around school uniform becoming mandatory from September 2026 we are reviewing the Academy uniform to ensure we are meeting these expectations. It will only be possible for the Academy to expect families to purchase a maximum of 3 items from the Academy supplier therefore we are proposing to move to having these items as jumper, polo shirt and PE t shirt. All students will be expected to wear dark grey pleated skirt, shorts or trousers. We will offer the PE quarterzip long sleeve top as an optional item however students may wear a plain black fleece or sweatshirt as an alternative during PE lessons. Current branded uniform items will be acceptable for existing students to wear until September 2027 however all new students to the Academy will be expected to wear the new uniform items.

Year 11


Welcome back! We hope you have had a good break and completed lots of Revision ready for the exams.
