

Athena science students were given the opportunity to hear from **Professor Steven Lee** on Friday. They enjoyed learning about cutting edge scientific research being completed at the **University of Cambridge** focussing on how microscopy can give insights into the causes of Parkinson's disease and help identify potential treatments.

Palm Paper and Nestlé visit Science Discovery Club





Students in Science Discovery Club were thrilled to welcome visitors from Palm Paper and **Nestlé** over the last couple of sessions. They discovered how science plays a vital role in manufacturing both paper and food products, hearing directly from Palm Paper's Head of Automation, and the Factory Manager and a Method Engineer from Nestlé Wisbech. Their insights inspired students to think about real-world careers in STEM. The students had a go at making a sheet of paper and developing a solution to move a pouch from a tray onto a conveyor using robotics. Over the next few weeks, students will be working alongside these businesses on genuine science research projects to achieve a bronze CREST Award. Science Discovery Club are also excited to welcome the Royal Navy in the coming weeks who are offering an additional project working with The University of Plymouth.

Both Palm Paper and Nestlé were impressed by the students and their insightful questions and enthusiasm. Well done and thank you to everyone involved.


